

#### A Year in Review

In 2024, we added 2,085 new items to the library's collection! The section that saw the most growth was the adult fiction collections, which had 382 new books added, with DVDs as a close second with 336 new items. Our smallest change was the Library of Things collection, which saw three new video games and seven new hotspots added.

Last year, 13,486 items from the library's collection were checked out, for a total of 26,099 checkouts. The most frequently checked out item was Hotspot #17, which went out a whopping 42 times in 2024! The DVD that saw the most check outs was Finestkind, with 23 checkouts. The Women by Kristin Hannah was the most circulated adult fiction book, and the most circulated audiobook, with 12 and 6 checkouts respectively. In the juvenile collection, the graphic novel *The Dark Secret* from the Wings of Fire series by Tui T. Sutherland saw the most action with 12 checkouts. Three video games tied at most popular, each with 9 checkouts—Sackboy: A Big Adventure, Kirby and the Forgotten Land, and Super Mario Odyssey. Also with 9 checkouts, Bluey: 5-Minute Stories was 2024's most popular picture book! Rounding out the collection with 8 checkouts is The Body Keeps the Score by Bessel A. van der Kolk for most popular adult non-fiction book, and Divine Rivals by Rebeca Ross tops the YA chart at 7 checkouts!

Last year, we also had 365 people get their library cards! Casco Township had the most new card sign-ups with 81 new cards, and Lee Township was in second place with 73 new cards. Ganges, the City of Fennville, and Clyde were neck-in-neck with 55, 54, and 51 new cards respectively. Manlius Township had the fewest with 46 new cards, and only 5 new Saugatuck Township patrons chose the Fennville District Library as the home library. If your community didn't have as many as new cards as you would like to see, make sure you tell your neighbors to get their library cards!

Cooking: If you can learn to cook wholesome, nutritious meals for yourself and your family, you'll save money and have a healthier lifestyle.

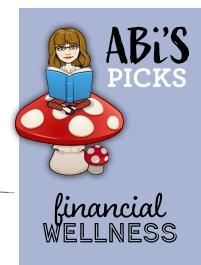

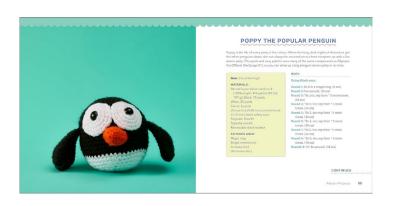
