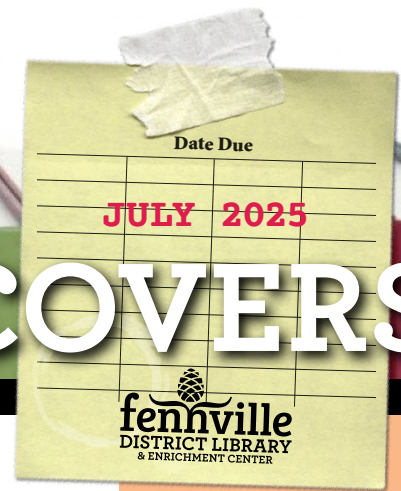

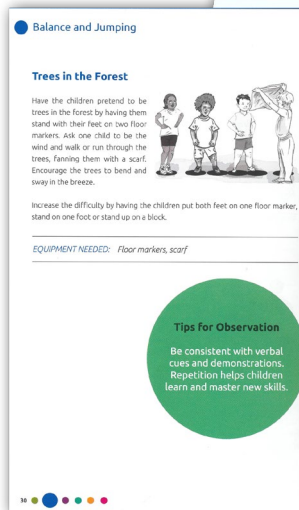

dreamlike adventure. Sanei's illustrations capture the magic one may experience in a dream perfectly. The illustrations are created using vibrant layers of acrylic gouache paint. I was fascinated by the amount of various colored layers you are able to explore by looking at one subject. Each subject illustrated, whether they are people, animals, plants or even the backgrounds, are filled with a variety of colors. The choice in color palette Sanei works in was very interesting as well. You are able to see an array of warm and cool colors in each of the illustrations. The amount of fun scribbles, patterns and details she adds using colored pencil elevate the whimsical dreamlike quality her illustrations possess. My favorite moment in the illustrations is the appearance of the blushy cheeked fish! Be sure to look closely for it, it's truly magical. Readers are sure to be filled with a spark of curiosity and awe as they journey through this surreal dream.

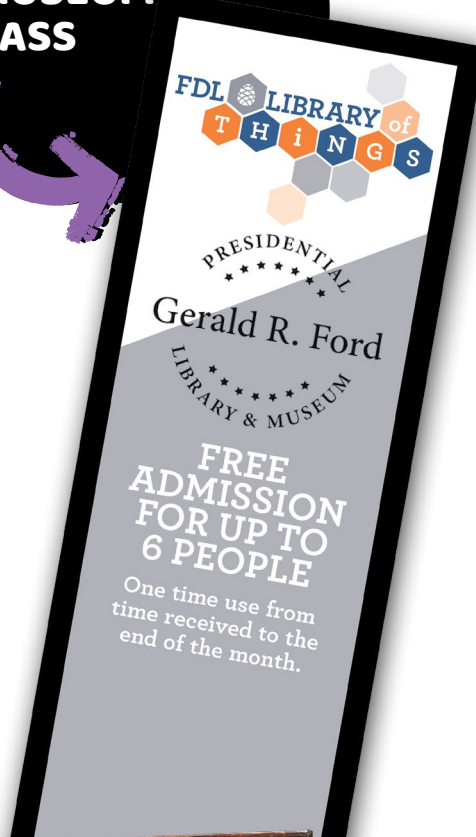

# HORROR

“Back then, when I was a young woman, there were still witches”: That was how Nana Alba always began the stories she told her great-granddaughter Minerva—stories that have stayed with Minerva all her life. Perhaps that’s why Minerva

has become a graduate student focused on the history of horror literature and is researching the life of Beatrice Tremblay, an obscure author of macabre tales.

In the course of assembling her thesis, Minerva uncovers information that reveals that Tremblay’s most famous novel, *The Vanishing*, was inspired by a true story.

As Minerva descends ever deeper into Tremblay’s manuscript, she begins to sense that the malign force that stalked Tremblay and the missing girl might still walk the halls of the campus. These disturbing events also echo the stories Nana Alba told about her girlhood in 1900s Mexico, where she had a terrifying encounter with a witch.

## The Library Book

by Susan Orlean

On the morning of April 29, 1986, a fire alarm sounded in the

Los Angeles Public Library. As the moments passed, the patrons and staff who had been cleared out of the building realized this was not the usual fire alarm. As one fireman recounted, "Once that first stack got going, it was 'Goodbye, Charlie.'" The fire was disastrous: it reached 2000 degrees and burned for more than seven hours. By the time it was extinguished, it had consumed four hundred thousand books and damaged seven hundred thousand more. Investigators descended on the scene, but more than thirty years later, the mystery remains: Did someone purposefully set fire to the library—and if so, who?

Weaving her lifelong love of books and reading into an investigation of the fire, award-winning New Yorker reporter and New York Times bestselling author Susan Orlean delivers a mesmerizing and uniquely compelling book that manages to tell the broader story of libraries and librarians.
