You can join in on this year's program, Trail of Stories: Color Our World, by signing up at the library, printing your own reading logs from our website, or through ReadSquared. This year's program does run a little bit differently than previous years though. You still want to earn 1,000 points, but rather than getting points for each book you read, you earn 25 points for every day you read! You can still earn points from doing fun activities as well. Once you have 500 points, you will get a fun halfway point prize, and once you have 1,000 points, you'll get a completion prize and an entry into the grand prize drawing of your choice. The last day to turn in summer reading logs and collect prizes is Monday, August 11, so sign up now so that you have as much time as possible to meet your goals!

We'll be handing out crafts, providing information, and just having fun. month's book, Sonya's Chickens, written and illustrated by Phoebe Wahl is an endearing story about life and death, a tough topic that readers may find difficult to share with their little ones, but important nonetheless. An aspect of Wahl's work I am really fond of is how her illustrations are able to depict the narrative all on their own, even if the text was omitted. In this book, Wahl enhances her work by using collage to add a variety of patterns and textures. From the carefully selected patterns she uses to add life to her characters and environments, to the emphasized color pencil scribbles she uses to add rosy cheeks and noses to her characters: there is so much thought and care found within the artwork. While the theme in this book may be glum, the coziness Wahl manages to incorporate in her illustrations reminds us of the warmth we are

able to embrace in

each of our lives.




NATIONAL GREAT OUTDOORS MONTH
