There are a few special and exciting programs coming to the library in May and early June. Make sure you get them into your schedules so you don't miss out!

First in the schedule are the Library Accessibility Community Conversations. These conversations are part of a grant awarded to the library from the Libraries Transforming Communities: Accessible Small and Rural Libraries initiative from the American Library Association and the Association for Rural and Small Libraries. To try to hear from as many people as possible, the library will be hosting two community conversations where participants can discuss disability accessibility at the library and what we can do to be more accessible. The library is specifically focusing on accessibility for people with blindness and/or low vision, but we would love to hear thoughts on other accessibility issues as well for future projects. The first conversation will be on Wednesday, May 15th at 3:30 PM, and the second will be on Thursday, May 23rd at 5:30 PM. Community members are welcome to attend one or both conversations. All participants will be entered into a raffle for a door prize at each conversation.

Also in May, the library is excited to be the host for Michigan Notable Author Richard Norton Smith on his tour to discuss his most recent book *An Ordinary Man: The Surprising Life and Historic Presidency of Gerald R. Ford.* Richard Norton Smith is a nationally recognized authority on the American presidency, as well as the acclaimed biographer of not just Gerald R. Ford but also George Washington, Herbert Hoover, and Nelson Rockefeller. He is also a familiar face to viewers of C-SPAN and The NewsHour with Jim Lehrer, where he has appeared. As part of the Michigan Notable Books Tour, he is visiting the Fennville District Library on Thursday, May 30th at 6:00 PM. Refreshments at the event will be provided by the Fennville Friends of the Library. The Michigan Notable Books Program, through which this tour is occurring, is sponsored by the Library of Michigan, the Library of Michigan Foundation, and Michigan Humanities, an affiliate of the National Endowment of the Humanities.

The next event to get on your calendars is the summer reading kickoff party for Trail of Stories: Adventure Begins! There will be two days of fun—on Friday, June 7 from 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM and Saturday, June 8 from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM. There will be games, crafts, music, face painting, refreshments, read-alouds, barbecue... Whatever time you come by, you're sure to find something great to enjoy!

Whether you come to just one event or all of them, we hope to see you at some of the special programs here at the library soon!

Portugal's. That same year, Franklin Roosevelt ordered the federal government to spark a dramatic expansion in domestic airplane production, and this minor effort would in time become what Roosevelt called "the arsenal of democracy," the full-throttle unleashing of American enterprise and ingenuity that was the secret weapon for victory in World War II.

In this "richly detailed, highly readable account of presidential leadership in perilous times" (New York Journal of Books), Craig Nelson traces how under FDR, the United States rose from poverty and solitude to defeat the greatest evils of the 20th century. By transforming what Americans thought they could achieve, FDR's efforts ended the Great Depression; conquered the fascists of Germany, Italy, and Japan; birthed America's middle-class affluence and consumer society; led to jet engines, computers, radar, the militaryindustrial complex, Big Science, and nuclear weapons; triggered a global economic boom; and turned the U.S. military into a worldwide titan—with America the undisputed leader of world affairs.


