public display for two days. As a local artist, Steve French had a history with our annual festival—from creating memorable posters to being a judge for the school art show. Several pieces have been added to the library's collection since last year, so make sure you stop in to check them and visit with two of his longtime friends, who volunteer to curate this one-of-a-kind art show.

While you are here, reminisce about festivals past with the Goose Festival History Exhibit. Track the evolution of 40 years with photos, banners, articles, flags and special memorabilia pieces, all on display here on the main level of the library.

Before you leave the library, don't forget the Fennville Friends of the Library Annual Book Sale. The book store is overflowing, so grab a paper bag for \$2.00 and fill it up!

On Thursday, October 24 at 5:30 PM, join local artist AJ Young for a discussion about the first two quilts in his Stitching Our Histories series. Stitching Our Histories is a series of quilts based on documents related to LGBTQ+ history and public policy. In addition to being a quilter, AJ also has a PhD in Sociology and this series combines his interests in social history and fiber arts. AJ will share about the origin of this quilt series, as well as about the U.S. government's Lavender Scare, which the first two quilts are based on. For ages 13+.

Sign up to try to identify a monster on the loose in our Escape Room (Recommended for ages 10 and up), do a fun craft, or just stop in to get some candy by telling us "trick or treat." A Long Petal of the Sea

by Isabel Allende

his Fascists succeed in overthrowing the government, hundreds of thousands are forced to flee in a treacherous journey over the mountains to the French border. Among them is Roser, a pregnant young widow, who finds her life intertwined with that of Victor Dalmau, an army doctor and the brother of her deceased love. In order to survive, the two must unite in a marriage neither of them desires.

Together with two thousand other refugees, they embark on the SS Winnipeg, a ship chartered by the poet Pablo Neruda, to Chile: "the long petal of sea and wine and snow." As unlikely partners, they embrace exile as the rest of Europe erupts in world war. Starting over on a new continent, their trials are just beginning, and over the course of their lives, they will face trial after trial. But they will also find joy as they patiently await the day when they will be exiles no more. Through it all, their hope of returning to Spain keeps them going. Destined to witness the battle between freedom and repression as it plays out across the world, Roser and Victor will find that home might have been closer than they thought all along.
