

Fennville District Library is one of many public libraries across the nation that will recognize and celebrate this special, annual week. Established in 1958 by the American Library Association, NLW promotes the idea that libraries and their services extend far beyond the physical walls of a library and that everyone is welcome to use them. This year's theme, "Welcome to Your Library," will take place April 4-10. For a number of years, the Library Board has honored the employees, members of the Friends of the Library, and other volunteers with an appreciation luncheon on National Library Workers Day which falls on April 6.

This year more than most, your library staff has been challenged by the COVID-19 pandemic to reach out to you the patrons. While the doors were closed for many months, Fennville Library continued working behind the scenes to adapt by offering expanded resources through technology. E-book access has greatly increased. A number of programs have been made available virtually for young people. The Book Club has continued meeting virtually. The catalog, available through the FDL website, has made material readily available. Patrons have been able to call or email requests for specific titles or on specific subjects. These requests have been filled by staff with drive-through pickup. And in case you wonder about the sanitizing of material that is checked and returned, each item is set aside and quarantined for four days before being reshelved for circulation. Through all this, the library staff have adhered closely to safety for the public as well as themselves by requiring masks, hand sanitizing and physical distancing once the library reopened.

More than ever, we owe a large expression of gratitude to staff and volunteers for their work. We hope you will say "thanks" next time you come to the library.

Speak: The Graphic Novel Laurie Halse Anderson

The Light of Days at tells the true story of incredible women whose courageous yet little-known feats have been eclipsed by time.

Witnesses to the brutal murder of their families and neighbors and the violent destruction of their communities, a cadre of Jewish women in Poland—some still in their teens—helped transform the Jewish youth groups into resistance cells to fight the Nazis. With courage, guile, and nerves of steel, these "ghetto girls" paid off Gestapo guards, hid revolvers in loaves of bread and jars of marmalade, and helped build systems of underground bunkers. They flirted with German soldiers, bribed them with wine, whiskey, and home cooking, used their Aryan looks to seduce them, and shot and killed them. They bombed German train lines and blew up a town's water supply. They also nursed the sick and taught children.

GRAPHIC NOVEL: The Night Witches

As the German Army smashes deep into Soviet Russia and the defenders of the Motherland retreat in disarray a new squadron arrives at a Russian forward airbase. Like all night bomber units they will risk fiery death flying obsolete biplanes against the invader--but unlike the rest these pilots and navigators are women.

Nickelodeon debuted the TV show Avatar: The Last Airbender (ATLA) in 2005. It wasn't until 2010. after a college friend told me about it, that I tuned-in. The premise behind this animated series is a world divided into four elemental nations – the Water Tribe, the Earth Kingdom, the Fire Nation, and the Air Nomads. The main characters, known as Benders, have the ability to control their element. Only the Avatar is the master of all four. ATLA

lasted for 3 seasons and can be viewed on Netflix. There is also a series of graphic novels that continues the story.

I was excited to see the book, The Rise of Kyoshi, make its way to our shelves. According to Goodreads, this book delves into the story of Kyoshi, the Earth Kingdom-born Avatar, mapping her journey from a girl of humble origins to the merciless pursuer of justice who is still feared and admired for centuries.



MICHELE'S MEDIA

Beartown (Björnstad) is a beautifully filmed Swedish language HBO miniseries based on the book of the same title by one of my favorite authors, Fredrik Backman.

Journey to a small, factorydriven, town in the middle of a wintery landscape where hockey is the life, or death, line for many of its residents. It's a complex, raw story about how sports culture and the fallout of an act of sexual violence can envelop a community and change it forever.

It is yet unclear if there will be a second season, but you can continue the story in print with the second book, *Us Against You*.

savvy, sophisticated Gordievsky grew to see his nation's communism as both criminal and philistine. He took his first posting for Russian intelligence in 1968 and eventually became the Soviet Union's top man in London, but from 1973 on he was secretly working for MI6.

For nearly a decade, as the Cold War reached its twilight, Gordievsky helped the West turn the tables on the KGB, exposing Russian spies and helping to foil countless intelligence plots, as the Soviet leadership grew increasingly paranoid at the United States's nuclear first-strike capabilities and brought the world closer to the brink of war.


