
Messy fun with painting inspired by Jackson Pollock.

One of the most influential books of the twentieth century gets the graphic treatment in this first-ever adaptation of George Orwell's 1984.

In 1984, London is a grim city in the totalitarian state of Oceania where Big Brother is always watching you and the Thought Police can practically read your mind. Winston Smith is a man in grave danger for the simple reason that his memory still functions. Drawn into a forbidden love affair, Winston finds the courage to join a secret revolutionary organization called the Brotherhood, dedicated to the destruction of the Party. Together with his beloved Julia, he hazards his life in a deadly match against the powers that be.

With evocative, immersive art from Fido Nesti, this vision of George Orwell's dystopian masterpiece provides a new perspective for longtime fans but is also an accessible entry point for young readers and adults who have yet to discover the iconic story that is still so relevant today.

Having viewed a few of the Marvel Cinematic Universe (MCU) movies, I was curious about the individual character stories Disney started producing.

Although I wasn't sure about a series featuring the villain Loki, due to the narcissistic nature of his character, I was intrigued by the possibility of seeing him from a new perspective. What I wasn't expecting was to finish this series contemplating the ideas of time, redemption, free-will, and one creator.

Within the first episode, you find yourself in a time-traveling, multi-verse, mind-bending experience that is highly entertaining and visually pleasing. I don't believe you need to have a MCU background to follow Loki's character development or story line in this series. The flashbacks give you what you need to fill in his timeline gaps. If you are looking for a deeper look into the life of Loki, there are many literary works, novel and graphic novel alike, to choose from.

**Isaac's Storm:

September 8, 1900, began innocently in the seaside town of Galveston, Texas. Even Isaac Cline, resident meteorologist for the U.S. Weather Bureau failed to grasp the true meaning of the strange deep-sea swells and peculiar winds that greeted the city that morning. Mere hours later, Galveston found itself submerged in a monster hurricane that completely destroyed the town and killed over six thousand people in what remains the greatest natural disaster in American history--and Isaac Cline found himself the victim of a devastating personal tragedy.

Using Cline's own telegrams, letters, and reports, the testimony of scores of survivors, and our latest understanding of the science of hurricanes, Erik Larson builds a chronicle of one man's heroic struggle and fatal miscalculation in the face of a storm of unimaginable magnitude. Riveting, powerful, and unbearably suspenseful, Isaac's Storm is the story of what can happen when human arrogance meets the great uncontrollable force of nature.


