The Fennville District Library's millage has expired. Voters in Casco Township, City of Fennville, Clyde Township and Ganges Township will vote on Tuesday, August 2, 2022.

FENNVILLE DISTRICT LIBRARY MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSITION

This millage would renew for ten (10) years the previous .60 mills levy which expired on December 31, 2021 for the operation of the Fennville District Library:

Shall the expired previous voted increase in the tax limitations imposed under Article IX, Sec. 6 of the Michigan Constitution, which may be assessed against all property subject to ad valorem taxation within the district of the Library (whose geographic boundaries are coterminous with those of Casco Township, City of Fennville, Clyde Township and Ganges Township) of .60 mills (\$0.60 per \$1,000 of taxable value), reduced to 0.56 mills (\$0.56 per \$1,000 of taxable value) by the required millage rollbacks, be renewed at up to .56 mills (\$0.56 per \$1,000 of taxable value) and levied for 10 years, 2022 through 2031 inclusive, to provide funds to enable the District Library to provide, operate, and maintain a district library, raising an estimated \$326,125.00 in the first year the millage is levied. To the extent required by law, a portion of the revenues from this millage will be captured within the district of and disbursed to the City of Fennville Downtown Development Authority.

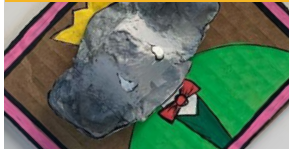

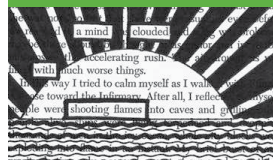

- 3) Hospitalization, insurance card or automobile registration
- 4) Printed check
- 5) Recent local property tax bill
