
MICHELE'S MEDIA

Sadly some issues are missing. These include August - December of 1894, January - February 16 of 1895, 1907 - 1910, 1927 - 1930, and 1934 - 1938. We do have many other resources in our local history collection to cross reference these missing years, helping you find that small gem of history.

The Fennville District Library will be participating in a federal grant to study health and wellness programming in public libraries. The project, *Community Health and Wellness: Small and Rural Library Practices, Perspectives and Programs* will study public libraries in Oklahoma, Vermont, North

Carolina and Michigan. The project will run from 2019 through 2022 and was funded by a \$475,785 IMLS National Leadership grant. The researchers will perform an in-depth analysis of how small and rural public libraries support community health and wellness through public programs.
