




BETWEEN THE COVERS

Temporary Exhibit Opening At Fennville District Library

The Woman’s Club of Fennville and Fennville District Library have collaborated to build a women’s history exhibit to be displayed on the lower level of the library at 400 W. Main St. in Fennville, MI. The exhibit—titled *Her Story, Then and Now: A Snapshot of Women in Fennville*—will open with a reception on Wednesday, July 5, 2023. The reception will be from 7:00 PM to 8:30 PM, and refreshments will be provided by the Woman’s Club of Fennville. After the reception, visitors will be welcome to explore the exhibit during the library’s normal operation hours until the exhibit closes on Monday, August 21, 2023.



Her Story, Then and Now: A Snapshot of Women in Fennville explores the history of women in Fennville, from before the city was founded to the present day. Alongside historical photographs, the exhibit contains snapshot profiles of fifty-seven (57) individual women or women’s groups who have shaped the community.

The idea for this exhibit was brought to the Fennville District Library by members of the Woman’s Club of Fennville. Initial research into the history of women in the area was completed by Fennville District Library staff member Kendra Onken. This research was then curated by Woman’s Club member Sharona Shapiro and community member Han Meadway. Based on the curated research, profiles of the individuals and groups featured were written by Fennville District Library director Teresa Kline, with editing provided by staff member Abi Avery. The final exhibit was designed by Fennville District Library staff member Michele Overweg-Spans.

All of the individuals involved in the creation of this exhibit hope that you are able to come out and learn about some of the women in Fennville’s past and present.

**After Hitler:
The Last Days
of World War

On 30 April 1945, Adolf Hitler committed suicide. The following day, his propaganda minister Joseph Goebbels also killed himself and the crumbling Third Reich passed to Admiral Karl Dönitz. The Nazis' position seemed hopeless. Yet remarkably, the war in the rest of Europe went on for another ten days. *After Hitler* looks at these days as a narrative day-by-day countdown but also as a broader global history of a European war that had seen some of the most savage battles in history. Relations between the 'Big Three' - the United States, Great Britain and the Soviet Union - suddenly plunged to near breaking point. This book reveals that tumultuous story.

After Hitler also looks at the wider canvas of the war and the terrible humanitarian catastrophe uncovered in Europe. It describes those who felt the joy of freedom, but also those who faced a highly uncertain future. As Red Army soldiers joined forces with their British and American allies, Stalin's East finally came face to face with Churchill's and Truman's West.
