

The Loverlys sit by the hospital bed of their young son who is in a coma after falling from his bedroom window in the middle of the night; his mother, Whitney, will not speak to anyone. Back home, their friends and neighbors are left in shock, each confronting their own role in the events that led up to what happened that terrible night: the

warm, altruistic Parks who are the Loverlys' best friends; the young, ambitious Goldsmiths who are struggling to start a family of their own; and the quiet, elderly Portuguese couple who care for their adult son with a developmental disability, and who pass the long days on the front porch, watching their neighbors go about their busy lives.

The story spins out over the course of one week, in the alternating voices of the women in each family as they are forced to face the secrets within the walls of their own homes, and the uncomfortable truths that connect them all to one another. Set against the heartwrenching drama of what will happen to Xavier, who hangs between death and life, or a life changed forever, *The Whispers* is a novel about what happens when we put our needs ahead of our children's. Exploring the quiet sacrifices of motherhood, the intuitions that we silence, the complexities of our closest friendships, and the danger of envy, this is a novel about the reverberations of life's most difficult decisions.

Happy World Outlander Day! It's no secret that I am a huge fan of the books and TV series, but to fill what fans call "droughtlander," I found myself enjoying the tales of adventure from two of the actors from the series.

Sam Heughan, who plays Jamie Fraser, takes us on a week-long adventure as he sets out on a nearly 100 mile hike through West Highland Way in his homeland of Scotland. In his book Waypoints: My Scottish Journey, Sam delights us with stories of his childhood and about his struggles as an actor, while he trudges on dayby-day over the rugged landscape, talking to mushrooms.

Sam and his counterpart Graham McTavish, who portrays his uncle Dougal MacKenzie, partake on a wild escapade documented on screen with Men in Kilts and in the book Clandlands: Whisky, Warfare, and a Scottish Adventure Like No Other. The brotherly banter between Sam and Graham makes for a fun way to learn about Scottish history, while learning a bit about their lives on and off screen.

By her brother's graveside, Liesel's life is changed when she picks up a single object, partially hidden in the snow. It is The Gravedigger's Handbook, left behind there by accident, and it is her first act of book thievery. So begins a love affair with books and words, as Liesel, with the help of her accordianplaying foster father, learns to read. Soon she is stealing books from Nazi book-burnings, the mayor's wife's library, wherever there are books to be found.


But these are dangerous times. When Liesel's foster family hides a Jew in their basement, Liesel's world is both opened up, and closed down.
