The King of Confidence

by Miles Harvey

In the summer of 1843, James Strang, a charismatic young lawyer and avowed atheist, vanished from a rural town in New York. Months later he reappeared on the Midwestern frontier and converted to a burgeoning religious movement known as Mormonism. In the wake of the murder of the sect's leader, Joseph Smith, Strang unveiled a letter purportedly from the prophet naming him successor, and persuaded hundreds of fellow converts to follow him to an island in Lake Michigan, where he declared himself a divine king.

From this stronghold he controlled a fourth of the state of Michigan, establishing a pirate colony where he practiced plural marriage and perpetrated thefts, corruption, and frauds of all kinds. Eventually, having run afoul of powerful enemies, including the American president, Strang was assassinated, an event that was frontpage news across the country.

Full of adventure, bad behavior, and insight into a crucial period of antebellum history, *The King of Confidence* brings us a compulsively readable account of one of the country's boldest con men and the boisterous era that allowed him to thrive.

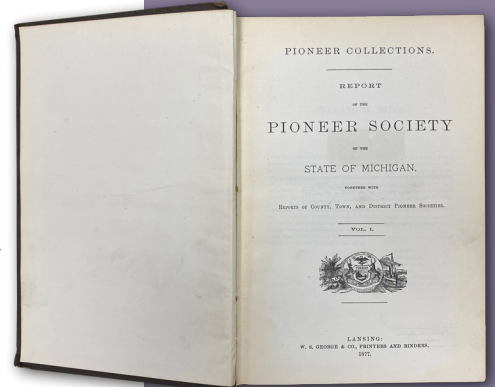

In 1876, the Pioneer Society of the State of Michigan decided to publish their proceedings and other historical material in a series of annual volumes. Altogether these forty volumes, commonly known as the Michigan Historical Collection, can be found in our Marlynn Starring Local History and Genealogy Collection.

The Michigan Pioneer and Historical Collections are an important—but often overlooked—Native American resource. Produced from materials presented at the annual meetings of the Michigan Pioneer and Historical Society, the collections contain a high quantity of primary resources and historical papers concerning many aspects of Michigan's past.

Getting started with Libby

- 1 Install the Libby app from the app store on your Android, or iOS (iPhone/iPad/iPod touch). Or, visit libbyapp.com in your Chrome, Firefox, Safari, or Edge browser.
- 2 In Libby, select Add Library Card. Choose Fennville as your location. Then, enter a valid library card #.
- 3 Browse your library's collection and borrow a title.
- 4 Borrowed titles appear on your Shelf and download to the app automatically when you're on Wi-Fi so that you can read them when you're offline. On your Shelf, tap loans at the top of the screen. From there, you can:
 - Tap Read With... to choose whether you'd like to open a book in *Kindle or Libby.
 - Tap Open In Libby, Open Magazine, or Open Audiobook to start reading or listening in the app.
 - Tap Manage Loan to see options like Renew and Return.
