### Tokyo Ghoul

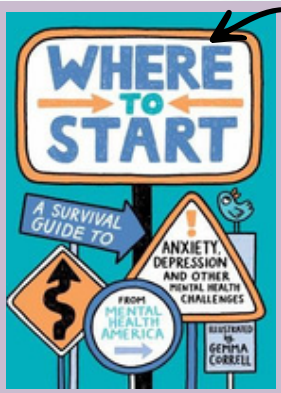

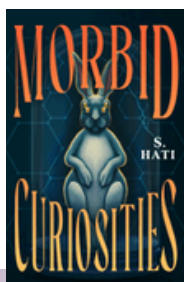
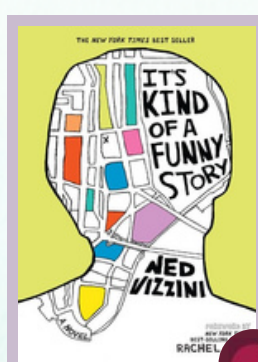
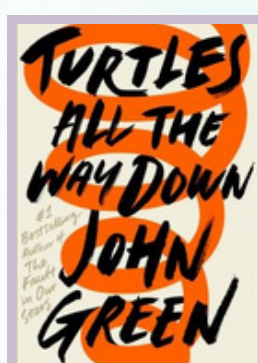
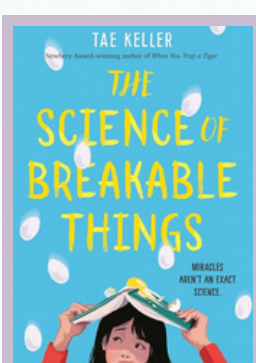
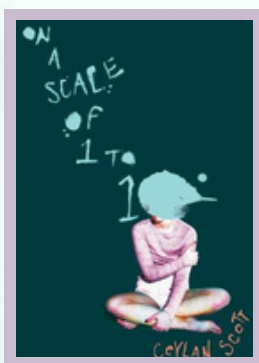




# Teen Reads for Mental Health Awareness Month

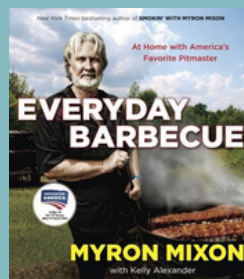

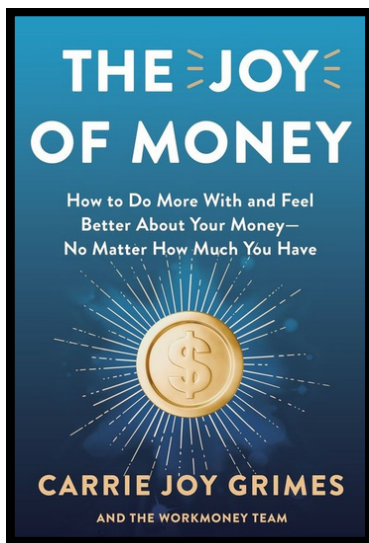

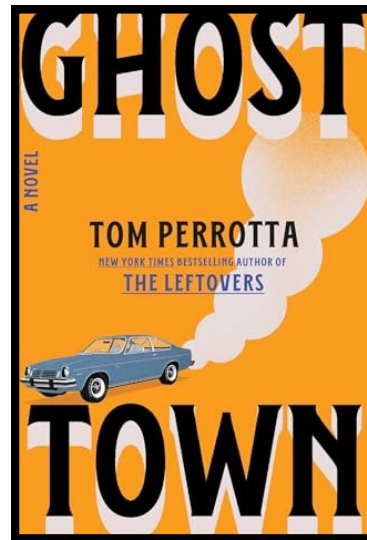
### The Joy of Money by Carrie Joy Grimes

### Krysta's AV Corner

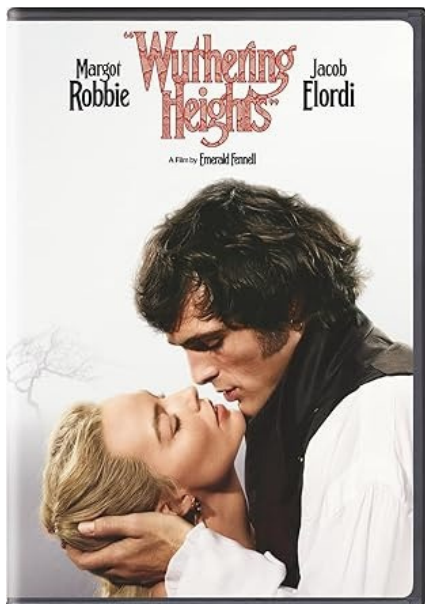

Together, these audiobooks highlight the depth and diversity of AAPI perspectives, making them powerful listens during this time of reflection and celebration.
