


The Kitchen Witch's Guide to Recipes for Love and Romance

Double Chocolate Brownies

- 1 cup of flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1 ¼ cups of unsweetened cocoa powder
- 3 cups of sugar
- A pinch of salt
- 1 cup of unsalted butter
- ½ cup coconut oil
- 12 oz chocolate chips
- 6 large eggs

- Combine flour, baking powder, cocoa, sugar and salt in a bowl
- Over low heat combine the butter, coconut oil, and chocolate chips. Stir until melted and combined
- Remove from heat, whisk in eggs and mix together with dry ingredients



In 1985, Anthony Ray Hinton was arrested and charged with two counts of capital murder in Alabama. But with no money and a different system of justice for a poor black man in the South, Hinton was sentenced to death by electrocution. He spent his first three years on Death Row at Holman State Prison in agonizing silence—full of despair and anger toward all those who had sent an innocent man to his death. As Hinton realized and accepted his fate, he resolved not only to survive, but find a way to live on Death Row. For the next twenty-seven years he was a beacon—transforming not only his own spirit, but those of his fellow inmates, fifty-four of whom were executed mere feet from his cell.


Please pardon our mess!


