


Julia's book of the month

### Oatmeal Chocolate Chip Cookies


Ingredients:

- 2 Sticks of butter (room temperature)
- 1 cup of brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 tbsp vanilla
- ½ tsp baking soda
- 1 cup all purpose flour
- 2 cups of oats
- 1 cup shredded coconut
- 12 oz chocolate chips
- ¾ cup almonds, chestnuts, or walnuts

Steps:

- Mix together butter and sugar, then add the eggs, vanilla, and baking soda
- Then add in flour, oats, coconut, and nuts
- Bake at 350 Fahrenheit for about 12-15 minutes
